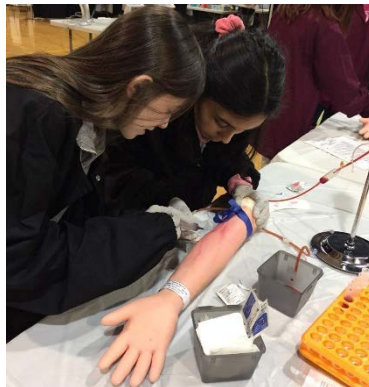

## Practice STAAR in Middle School

SFMS will be Practice-STAAR testing 6<sup>th</sup>- and 7<sup>th</sup>-grade Reading, 6<sup>th</sup>- and 7<sup>th</sup>-grade Math, and Algebra I March 10 and 11. SBAI will also administer the Practice STAAR to students testing these levels using elective time but will continue with SBAI classes as well. Monday/Tuesday schedules run all week. There is no word yet if either test day will be a reverse schedule. Electives will be held for eighth graders. Some 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> graders not testing will be able to attend electives that are still be held. Testing schedules will be posted in the SBAI Pod.

## Preparing for High School

Eighth-grade students will be asked to choose an endorsement, similar to a college major as it is an "area of interest" that students may pursue in high school. The five endorsement areas are Arts and Humanities, Business and Industry, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math), Public Service, and Multidisciplinary Studies. Students are able to earn more than one endorsement and change endorsement any time before their junior year. A pathway is a series of course options needed to earn a particular endorsement. There are several pathways within an endorsement.

## **Spring 2020 Final Exam**

### **Exemption Policy**

**An exemption is an opportunity to not take the semester final for a class. To qualify, each student must meet the Attendance & Discipline Criteria.**

<b>No more than 5 absences in any class and Spartan Time</b>
<b>No more than 2 absences in the exempted class(es)</b>
<b>Four tardies count as one absence</b>
<b>Suspension (in school or off campus), truancy or a “U” in conduct eliminates the possibility of being exempt</b>

***To earn an exemption in a grade level, PreAP, or AP class, a student must have a minimum semester average of 80 and meet the Attendance & Discipline Criteria.***

<b><i>Seniors may earn 8 exemptions</i></b>
<b><i>Juniors may earn 3 exemptions</i></b>
<b><i>Sophomores may earn 2 exemptions</i></b>
<b><i>Freshmen may earn 1 exemption</i></b>

**The Grade Level Principal’s decision in determining exemption status is final.**

The Navy Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps is a unique program, facilitated by senior Navy retired instructors, providing real hands on leadership and management opportunities unlike any other high school program. NJROTC instills the pride of community service and good citizenship. A first year cadet can expect to be leading a squad by the completion of the first year and eligible to command the entire company of cadets by his/her senior year. Cadets plan, schedule, organize and execute a myriad of program activities to include local, regional and national competitive team activities including drill, marksmanship, physical fitness, orienteering (land navigation) and academics. The Spring Branch Navy JROTC unit has earned national academic honors for the past 13 years. The Navy provides all books, equipment and uniforms at no cost to students participating in the JROTC program. There is no military obligation to participate in the program. However, cadets completing two years of NJROTC who choose to enlist earn a rate increase of one pay grade upon completion of boot camp and cadets completing three years advance two pay grades, resulting in a significant increase in basic pay. Additional educational opportunities exist through attendance at any of the service academies such as the Naval Academy or through Navy ROTC scholarships.

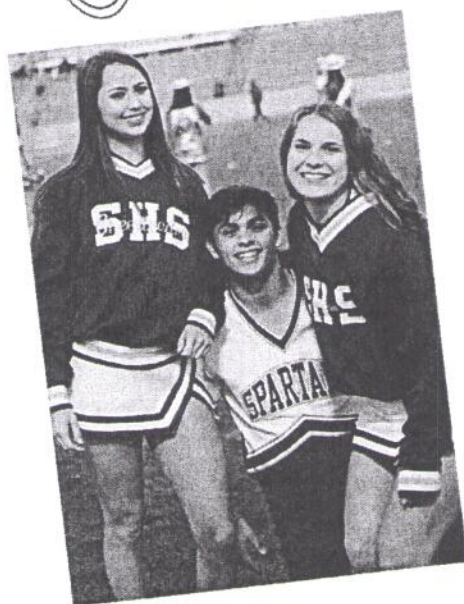
