#### **SFMS Family Movie Night**

#### **SFMS Bridge Year Event**

#### **SFMS Early Release**

February 27 is an early release day at SFMS. Student will attend all seven classes and be released at 1:35 pm. Because the classes will be shorter, we will not run buses Thursday. Students will report to D207 or the MPR for SBAI courses.

#### SHS Academy of Science and Engineering

Academy of Science and Engineering is a selective two year two- or three-year program that students apply for after meeting the prerequisites. The first year consists of hands-on lab based classes that revolve around project-based learning. Some of the topics covered include engineering, forensics, alternative energy, medicine, programming, and 3D printing. The program's curriculum is highly driven by student interests, in-fact, the entirety of the second year is a yearlong capstone built around student interests. The capstone project is a self-directed passion project in a group atmosphere. Students meet during Spartan Time after completing the first-year course. Some of the past projects have included published iPhone apps, research projects, alternative energy vehicles, hydrogen fuel cells, and worldwide community service. Past students have received patents, scholarships, and even internships because of their capstone projects. Please read the ASE guidelines and complete the online application by March 1.

#### Middle School and High School 101

March 25 information will be shared with families on the transition to middle school and high school. This two-part event will consist of a SBAI presentation, a student & parent panel who will convey advice, and a question and answer session. The evening is geared toward fifth and eighth grade families, but all are welcome. Middle School 101 will start at 5:00 in the Thornwood library and last until 5:45. High School 101 will start at 6:00 and go until 7:00.

#### **Parents of Current Sixth Graders**

For the 2020-2021 school year, all incoming seventh grade students are required by the state to have vaccines in order to start school. If your child has not yet had these immunizations, it is advised to get them before the end of this school year and documented in the clinic computer system. If your child has already had these immunizations, please make sure to send a copy of the record to the SFMS office. The immunization record can be sent with the student, brought to the main office or clinic, or FAXED to the school nurse. Students CANNOT start school in August without the immunizations. The immunizations that are required are Tdap, Meningococcal (MCV4, Menactra), Contact <u>Kathryn</u> <u>Brown R.N.</u> or <u>Jackie Daniels R.N.</u> with questions. 713-251-4625, 713-251-4600

#### **Preparing for High School**

Eighth-grade students will be asked to choose an endorsement, similar to a college major as it is an "area of interest" that students may pursue in high school. The five endorsement areas are Arts and Humanities, Business and Industry, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math), Public Service, and Multidisciplinary Studies. Students are able to earn more than one endorsement and change endorsement any time before their junior year. A pathway is a series of course options needed to earn a particular endorsement. There are several pathways within an endorsement. Below is a Graduation Toolkit produced by the Texas Education Agency. #### Pathways of the Week

A Public Service Endorsement with a Navy Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (NJROTC) Pathway. Guthrie Site. The Navy Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps is a unique program, facilitated by senior Navy retired instructors, providing real hands on leadership and management opportunities unlike any other high school program. NJROTC instills the pride of community service and good citizenship. A first year cadet can expect to be leading a squad by the completion of the first year and eligible to command the entire company of cadets by his/her senior year. Cadets plan, schedule, organize and execute a myriad of program activities to include local, regional and national competitive team activities including drill, marksmanship, physical fitness, orienteering (land navigation) and academics. The Spring Branch Navy JROTC unit has earned national academic honors for the past 13 years. The Navy provides all books, equipment and uniforms at no cost to students participating in the JROTC program. There is no military obligation to participate in the program. However, cadets completing two years of NJROTC who choose to enlist earn a rate increase of one pay grade upon completion of boot camp and cadets completing three years advance two pay grades, resulting in a significant increase in basic pay. Additional educational opportunities exist through attendance at any of the service academies such as the Naval Academy or through Navy ROTC scholarships.

The Navy Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps is a unique program, facilitated by senior Navy retired instructors, providing real hands on leadership and management opportunities unlike any other high school program. NJROTC instills the pride of community service and good citizenship. A first year cadet can expect to be leading a squad by the completion of the first year and eligible to command the entire company of cadets by his/her senior year. Cadets plan, schedule, organize and execute a myriad of program activities to include local, regional and national competitive team activities including drill, marksmanship, physical fitness, orienteering (land navigation) and academics. The Spring Branch Navy JROTC unit has earned national academic honors for the past 13 years. The Navy provides all books, equipment and uniforms at no cost to students participating in the JROTC program. There is no military obligation to participate in the program. However, cadets completing two years of NJROTC who choose to enlist earn a rate increase of one pay grade upon completion of boot camp and cadets completing three years advance two pay grades, resulting in a significant increase in basic pay. Additional educational opportunities exist through attendance at any of the service academies such as the Naval Academy or through Navy ROTC scholarships.
