All SBAI students will be at Stratford after 7th lunch (be on the 12:48 bus) until the end of the Science Fair. Dr. Haidar will contact parents who expressed their willingness to be a SBAI Science Fair Judge soon. A short meeting will be held at 4:00 on November 8 at SBAI pod to discuss Science Fair Rubric and other logistics. Ten finalist from SBAI Science Fair will be recommended for the District Science Fair competition (Date not yet announced). District Science Fair winners will move to Science and Engineering Fair of Houston for presentation on February 15, 2020 at George R. Brown Convention Center. Preparing for High School

Eighth-grade students will be asked to choose an endorsement, similar to a college major as it is an "area of interest" that students may pursue in high school. The five endorsement areas are Arts and Humanities, Business and Industry, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math), Public Service, and Multidisciplinary Studies. Students are able to earn more than one endorsement and change endorsement any time before their junior year. A pathway is a series of course options needed to earn a particular endorsement. There are several pathways within an endorsement.

Pathways of the Week

Business and Industry Endorsement with a Pathway in the <u>Information Technology Cluster</u>. <u>Guthrie</u> <u>Website</u>

<u>The Computer Networking Pathway</u> will provide students with an understanding of the opportunities and skills needed for careers in computer networking. Topics include learning how to configure routers and setup small networks using many commercial design and network administrator tools. Students have the opportunity to earn CCENT (Cisco Certification Entry Network Technician) certification.

<u>The Computer Service Technician Pathway</u> will provide students with an understanding of the opportunities and skills needed for careers in the computer service industry. Topics include assembling and configuring computers, installing operating systems, software, and setting up/ troubleshooting hardware, software and networks. Students have the opportunity to earn a CompTIA A+ certification.

<u>The Geological Data Technician Pathway</u> will provide students with an understanding of the opportunities and skills needed for careers as a Geo-Technician. Topics include basic programming, viewing, interpreting and analyzing data, reading data maps, use GIS databases, and design and prepare graphic representation of GIS data. Students have the opportunity to earn a Microsoft Office Specialist Word certification.



Dear Stratford Families,

We are excited to announce that on October 29th and 30th of this school year, we will provide every student at Stratford High School with the opportunity to participate in the Spring Branch ISD Chromebook Loaner Program. With this device, students will have access to anywhere, anytime learning and will be able to engage with their classes, teachers, and peers in new and exciting ways.

It is our expectation that every student will come to school each day with a portable computer <u>charged for a full</u> <u>day of use</u>. Students have the option to bring a laptop from home or participate in the Chromebook Loaner Program. This will enable students to access itsLearning, a learning management system already being used in our classes to access course content.

Prior to receiving Chromebooks, students will need to have the <u>SBISD Student Device Loan Agreement</u> signed by a parent or guardian. The second page of this agreement should be **returned to the library**. This document addresses the loan conditions as well as the optional \$25.00 technology damage coverage.

Please read the coverage agreement carefully as it is specific with regards to financial responsibility and what is and is not covered by the optional damage coverage. If you elect to purchase the Optional Technology Damage Coverage, then you may pay by check (payable to Stratford HS), cash in exact amount, or through <u>MySchoolBucks</u>, a secure online payment system accepting credit cards, debit cards, and electronic checks.

Any student who prefers to bring their own device to school can opt out of the Chromebook Loaner Program as long as the device has a screen size of at least 9 inches, has keyboard capability, and has the ability to connect to the school's wireless network. All students will be expected to abide by the <u>SBISD Student Acceptable Use</u> <u>Policy</u> regardless of the device they use.

Action Steps for students participating in the Chromebook Loaner Program:

Please return:

- A signed <u>SBISD Student Device Loan Agreement</u> to the Library by October 18th (required)
- Technology Damage Coverage fee to the Library from 7:30-8:15AM or 2:30-3:15PM by October 18th (optional, but recommended not necessary for those using MySchoolBucks)

I will host an optional informational meeting regarding the Chromebook Loaner Program on Monday, October 7, 2019 at 6:00PM in the Library. During this session, I will explain the benefits of our digital learning tools, describe our plan for distribution, and answer any questions you may have.
