## College Board Exams

Wednesday, October 7 is the PSAT 8 and 9 exams. Grades 6, 7, 10, and 11 will have a day of asynchronous learning. Eighth and ninth graders will report to SBAI Pod by 8:40 and 7:45 respectively. Dismissal will be at 3:00 for ninth graders and 3:15 for eighth graders. On October 8, middle-school students will meet with all seven classes. The letter sent families is attached to the newsletter. Days in which a grade level takes a College Board exam, other students will have an asynchronous, virtual learning day.

## Science Fair

SBAI's third annual science fair is under way. The science fair is part of the SBAI middle-school science curriculum. We are inviting high school students to participate as well. Through the development and presentation of science/engineering projects, students enhance the following abilities: making observations, asking questions regarding particular phenomena or situations, formulating ideas and procedures for the solution of a problem, using complex and/or analytical reasoning skills to find an answer or a solution to a problem, and effectively presenting their works to society. Colleges look for students who establish and nurture a clear passion and expertise in whatever they choose to pursue. Volunteering to compete in science fair would show that passion. All experiments and data analysis is to be completed before winter break. The SBAI Science Fair will be on Friday, January 8, 2021. We will have enough time to register SBAI winners for Science and Engineering Fair of Houston. Registration and date of SEFH are still to be determined.

Parents,

This afternoon, middle-school families received a letter regarding the upcoming College Board PSAT – 8 exam. It is a Pre SAT assessment that provides students a chance to practice and receive feedback as they prepare to take the SAT exam. There are other College Board tests given to high school students, PSAT – 9, PSAT – 10, and the National Merit Scholar Qualifying Test.

The letter received by middle school parents, high school parents should receive information tomorrow, explained, “Due to social distancing and test supervision logistics for our eighth graders, our middle schools will need additional teachers to serve as proctors and additional classroom space to serve as testing locations.”

On the days of the College Board tests, both middle and high school, grade levels not testing will have a virtual, asynchronous learning day in which they work independently on their schoolwork. For families who have chosen virtual learning, those students will be encouraged to come to school for the opportunity to take these important tests.

October 7 PSAT – 8 and PSAT – 9

We will test the 25 SBAI students, both in-person and virtual, in the four SBAI classrooms. Grades 6, 7, 10, and 11 will learn asynchronously that day, no Zoom sessions.

October 14 [National Merit Scholar](#) Qualifying Test for Juniors

We will test our juniors, both in-person and virtual, in the SBAI pod. We will need rooms, teachers, and a quiet environment to administer the exam. Grades 6 – 10 will learn asynchronously that day, no Zoom sessions.

October 27 In-School SAT for seniors

Since we have no seniors, we will not need teachers or rooms to proctor the exam. In-person middle school students will report to Stratford for simultaneous classes that day. Like other Stratford students, SBAI students grades 9 – 11 will learn virtually. There will be Zoom sessions with SBAI high school teachers only. Stratford teachers will be proctoring, thus unavailable for Zoom sessions. NOTE: This is after families have had a chance to change their learning model. SBAI may want to revisit this plan for middle-school students.

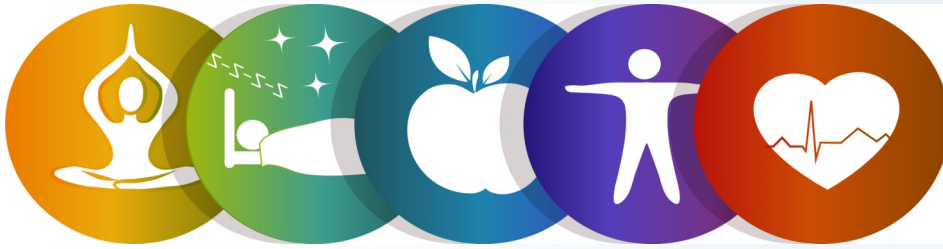
October 29 PSAT – 10

We will test our sophomores, both in-person and virtual, in the SBAI pod. We will need rooms, teachers, and a quiet environment to administer the exam. Grades 6, 7, 8, 9, and 11 will learn asynchronously that day, no Zoom sessions. NOTE: This is after families have had a chance to change their learning model. SBAI may want to revisit this plan for middle-school students.

The letter also states, “Your principal will provide school-specific information closer to the October 7 date.” As we get more guidance from the district and we work in conjunction with Stratford’s plan, we will share more information.

We will have a test booklet and a desk for every SBAI student on the day of their exam. You do not need to register with College Board. By the end of September, we will reach out to virtual families to confirm whether their student will take their grade-level exam.
