

Learning Model Selection Change Form: Online Form 3rd Nine Weeks

Spring Branch Independent School District

As outlined in the LearnSBISD plan, between November 13 and November 20, 2020, families must complete this form if they want to change their child's learning model for the third nine-week grading period. The third nine weeks will begin on January 5, 2021.

This form is only required for students whose families wish to change their Learning Model from in-person learning to distance learning, or from distance learning to in-person learning.

If your student will remain in their current Learning Model for the third nine weeks, no action is required.

Deadline to Notify SBISD:

Please complete this form in Skyward Family Access or submit this signed form inperson or by email to your child's school by Friday, November 20, 2020, for each child in your family whose Learning Model will change for the second nine weeks beginning on January 5.

DISTANCE LEARNING MODEL:

In the Distance Learning program, the students will receive instruction in an online environment and will follow a daily schedule. The schedule will follow the homezoned campus bell schedule, in most cases. Students will be required to participate in live, real-time instruction and complete independent pre-assigned classwork every school day. Attendance is required every day. Students participating in distance learning will receive a district-approved device, appropriate to their grade level. Students may be required to report to a campus from time to time based on course requirements.

Students attending school, either in-person or via distance learning, will be subject to the same daily attendance, instructional schedule, and grading guidelines.

Families of students who move from distance learning to in-person learning model must also complete two additional forms: In-Person Acknowledgement Form and Mask Accommodation form. These forms are also available in Skyward Family Access. The families will also be required to complete the daily SBISD health screener beginning on January 5.
